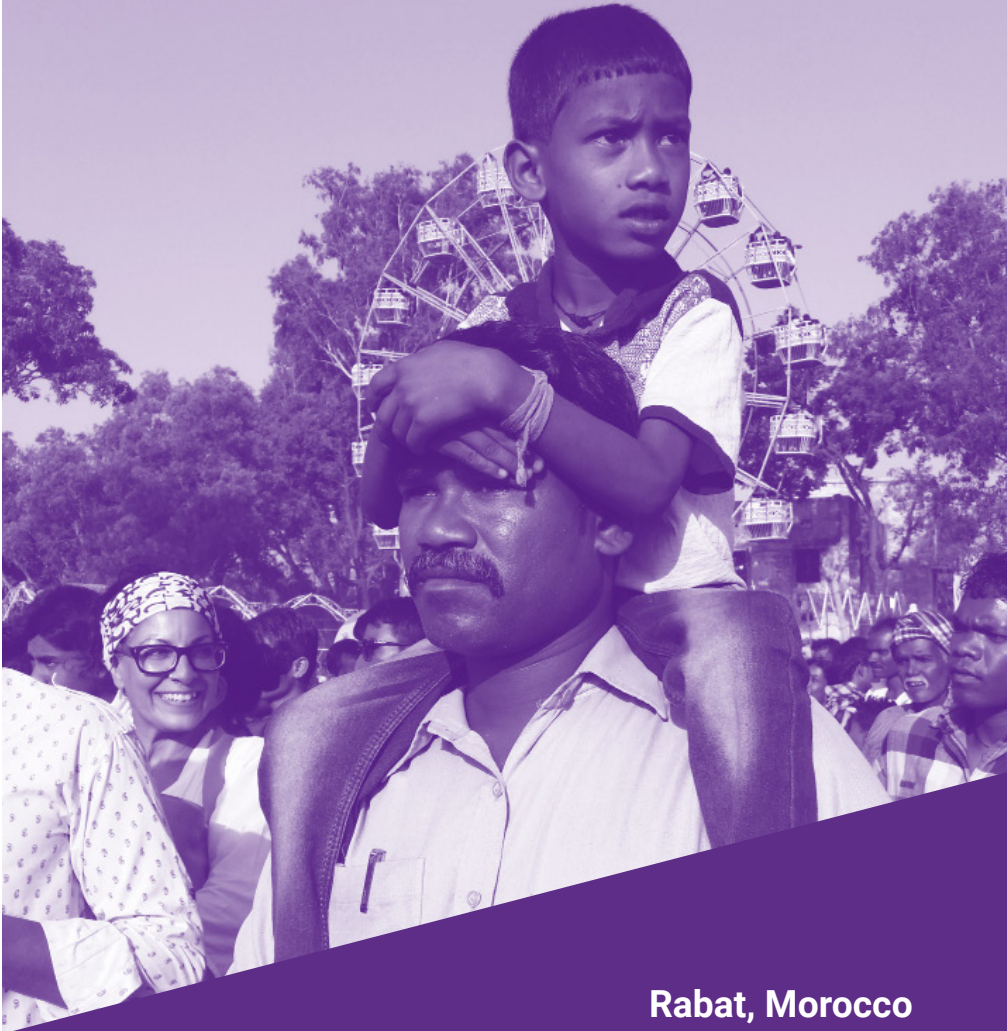

Portraits from photographer Johan Bävman’s “Swedish Dads” photo exhibition will also be displayed. These photos examine fathers who have seized the opportunity of staying at home with their children for six months or more using Sweden’s parental allowance system and how their relationship with their partners and their children have changed as a result.

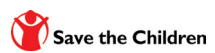
