CHILE - The <u>5th International Colloquium on Men and Masculinities</u> <u>Studies</u>, "Patriarchy in the 21st Century: Changes and Resistance," attracted over 300 participants to Santiago, Chile from January 14-16, 2015. Seminars, debates, and panel discussions during the three-day event covered a range of topics related to men and masculinities, including gender-based violence, sexual and reproductive health and rights, sexual diversity, and the construction of nonviolent masculinities. There were also discussions on men and care, emerging models of fatherhood, and men's involvement in maternal and child health.

MenCare Bulgaria releases results of study on male involvement in childcare



BULGARIA - <u>MenCare Bulgaria</u> conducted a study assessing attitudes and norms around men's participation in caregiving. Entitled "Attitudes, Practices, and Barriers to Active Men's Engagement in Child Care," the study highlights the importance of the active involvement of men in children's lives, and it aims to shed light on social norms related to gender roles in the household. A key finding of the study is that while engaged fatherhood has become more widely accepted in Bulgarian society, the proportion of fathers who are involved in childcare, education, and health is considerably lower than that of mothers.

Participants reported the stigma of male involvement in caregiving as a barrier to engagement. The study found that the main barriers to the active involvement of men in childcare and home activities were a preoccupation with providing financial security, stereotypes around men and caregiving, and insufficient public awareness of the importance of the paternal role in child care.

INDONESIA - In Jombang, East Java, where patriarchal culture remains strongly rooted within the community, designing initiatives to increase men's participation in sharing the household workload requires creativity. Many of the activities that are included in the <u>MenCare+ Indonesia</u> ("Laki Laki Peduli") campaign touch on parents' personal qualities and employ creative entry points for getting fathers involved in sharing the care work. One such activity is the campaign's "Cooking Competition for Dad."

"Cooking Competition for Dad" was held in December 2014 during the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence Campaign. There were 25 male participants in this competition who were eager to be involved in the MenCare+ program.



MenCare+ Indonesia holds training on involving men in the health sector



INDONESIA - From December 15-19, 2014, <u>MenCare+ Indonesia</u> held a training on male involvement in the health sector. Twelve participants from four provinces in Indonesia participated in this program.

The training highlighted the need for health workers to increase their awareness and action around key issues, including: promoting men's presence in the health system as supportive partners to women, as well as encouraging male involvement in maternal and reproductive health, especially during childbirth. The aims of the training were to address the importance of prenatal and antenatal care and to discuss how health care professionals can actively engage fathers - more specifically, how professionals can improve interactions with one or both partners, right up to the last prenatal care visit

Father of the Year Awards celebrate involved fatherhood in Russia



RUSSIA - On December 20, 2014, Russia held the 2014 Father of Year Awards. Hundreds of fathers from 25 regions competed, and 11 received awards. The public voted for the nominees online, and a jury approved the final winners. The award brought attention to the importance of responsible and involved fatherhood and to the promotion of positive father figures across Russia.

Government of Belarus to discuss law for domestic violence prevention

BELARUS - The Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Ministry of Labor and Social Protection in Belarus have been working toward <u>a law for the</u> <u>prevention of domestic and family violence</u>, to be prepared for discussion in May 2015. According to research conducted by UNFPA in 2014, 77 percent of Belarusian women and men aged 18 to 60 have experienced some form of domestic violence. In addition, one in three women are subjected to physical abuse, and one in five experience sexual violence in their family. With regards to childrearing practices, only a third of children in Belarus are raised without the use of violence.

The development of a law on domestic violence is an important step both at the state and the international levels. Similar laws are already in place in Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Moldova, Lithuania, Austria, Great Britain, Spain and many other countries. Belarus and Russia, however, still do not have laws to address the prevention of domestic violence.
