## Blog: The Fascinating Story of Patrick Godana: Activist and Ally for Involved Fatherhood in South Africa



SOUTH AFRICA - Patrick Godana was highly involved in the political liberation of South Africa, had to leave the country as a boy, was trained as a combatant, and a few months after his return to South Africa, was arrested, tortured, heavily interrogated and later tried and sentenced to 5 years imprisonment.

He now works with <u>Sonke Gender Justice</u>, <u>MenCare</u>'s Co-Coordinator, in their Community Education and Mobilization Unit, engaging fathers to take positive stands against all forms of gender violence and HIV/AIDS, and working with fathers to support them in their role in the care and protection of children, thus benefitting families and the community at large.

#### MenCare+ Will Address Violence in 4 Districts in Rwanda

RWANDA - Mencare+ has now been successfully launched in four Districts of Rwanda (Musanze, Karongi, Nyaruguru and Rwamagana) - those which were deemed to have the highest levels of gender-based violence in the country. These District Launches sparked interest from local officials as well as from journalists; several newspapers and radio stations covered the events. Check out a few pictures.

The project targets about 9,000 men, boys, women and girls, and will focus on developing the role of men in promoting best family practices and ensuring better environments for both women and children.

Community members will be reached through group education, campaigns, village level meetings and Umuganda (community work) in particular.

## Fathers Care is active in 200 Villages in Maharashtra, India

INDIA - The Fatherhood Campaign has now been implemented in 8 Districts and 200 villages in Maharashtra, India.

The campaign is coordinated by the Centre for Health and Social Justice and focuses on bringing visibility to the idea of caring fatherhood and to those fathers who are already involved in caregiving. They address the notion of 'masculinity, seeking to help fathers become in touch with their emotions.

Implementing partners work with children to disseminate their messages, and coordinate teacher trainings, fathers' groups and community campaigns as part of their efforts.
